Since 1957, the Commemorative Air Force (CAF) has used its collection of aircraft to tell the stories of World War II and bring history to life. Today, the CAF owns and operates the largest collection of vintage military warbirds in the world. These aircraft play a central role in the CAF's educational outreach programs that reach an estimated 20 million Americans each year, providing unique, compelling hands-on access to history through aviation events, programs, and airshows.

The National headquarters is the CAF National Airbase Campus at Dallas Executive Airport in Texas. In Spring 2021, the CAF completed construction of a cornerstone building of the campus and the hub for the organization's educational programs, the Henry B. Tippie National Aviation Education Center (NAEC). The NAEC is a 47,000 square foot facility that includes workshops, classrooms, and meeting spaces, a STEM Innovation Hangar (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math), and space to display historical artifacts, including selected World War II Nose Art panels.



The outdoor space between the CAF's National Headquarters and the Henry B. Tippie National Aviation Education Center is known as the Victory Plaza. In recognition of those who support the CAF's mission to Educate, Inspire, and Honor, and the NAEC's mission to Honor the Past, Empower the Future, the organization has embarked on a brick campaign in the high-profile Victory Plaza. We invite you to pay tribute to the loved ones, family members, friends, or mentors that deserve recognition for their belief in honoring the past, by keeping their legacy alive through compelling and engaging education.
