

- 12. The sinking of the *USS Indianapolis*.
- 13. Student pilots learn to fly in the PT-17 "Stearman" primary trainer.
- 14. Boeing B-17 "Flying Fortress" heavy bomber based in England being loaded before a mission over Nazi-occupied Germany.
- 15. American tanks, under the command of General Patton, take the fight to the Germans in North Africa.
- 16. Boeing B-29 "Superfortresses" being built in Seattle, Washington. 65% of all aircraft workers are women.

- 17. Escort Carrier USS Liscome Bay, torpedoed by a Japanese submarine in the Battle of the Gilbert Islands. African-American Doris "Dorie" Miller was on board. The hero of Pearl Harbor is among the crew missingin-action and presumed dead.
- 18. 101st Airborne Division paratroopers marching at Camp Claiborne, Louisiana.
- 19. At Randolph Field, "The West Point of the Air," instructor trainees walk between rows of AT-9 "Jeep" aircraft, one of the principal aircraft used in the advanced phase of pilot training. Randolph is one of many flight training bases in Texas.
- 20. 1st Lieutenant Charles B. Hall, in the cockpit of his Curtiss-Wright P-40L Warhawk fighter, points to a swastika which represents the Luftwaffe Focke-Wulf Fw 190 that he shot down. Hall is a member of the 99th Fighter Squadron, a unit of the "Tuskegee Airmen."
